



# TEACH Grant

## Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant

The TEACH Grant is a federally-funded program created to help college students who plan to teach pay for college. These grants are available to eligible undergraduate, post-baccalaureate, and graduate students who agree to serve as full-time teachers in high-need fields at schools that serve students from low-income families. The information below will help you understand the program qualifications and requirements.

### Applicant Qualifications:

A grant recipient must:

- Be a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- Be enrolled<sup>1</sup> as:
  - an undergraduate student; or
  - a graduate student; or
  - a post-baccalaureate student in a program required by the State to obtain a teaching credential at a college that does not offer a baccalaureate degree in education.
- Be enrolled<sup>1</sup> in or plan to enroll in coursework that is necessary to begin a career in teaching.

<sup>1</sup> Not all colleges and universities participate in the TEACH Grant program. ### Academic Standards<sup>2</sup>:

Applicants must meet one of the two following academic achievement requirements:

- Maintain a cumulative 3.25 GPA on 4.0 scale.
  - Eligibility for first-time, first-year college students is based on high school cumulative GPA.
- Score above the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile on at least one of the batteries in an undergraduate, post-baccalaureate or graduate program admissions test.



### IMPORTANT

If you don't fulfill the required teaching service, your TEACH Grants will become unsubsidized Direct Stafford loans that must be repaid with interest accrued from the first disbursement date of each grant!

<sup>2</sup> The academic achievement requirements described here do not apply to graduate degree candidates who are current teachers or retirees from another occupation with expertise in a high-need field, or former teachers pursuing a high-quality alternative certification.

### Application Process:

An applicant must:

- File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Complete a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve before each annual award. (See additional information on reverse side).

A recipient must:

- Participate in TEACH Grant counseling before each annual award and before graduation.

## Award Amounts:

- Maximum of \$4,000 per year - amount is reduced for students enrolled less than full time
  - TEACH Grant plus other financial aid may not exceed cost of attendance (COA)
- Undergraduate and post-baccalaureate (non-graduate) combined aggregate total maximum of \$16,000
- Graduate aggregate total maximum of \$8,000

## Additional Information:

### • High-Need Fields

The high-need fields<sup>3</sup> recognized for the TEACH Grant are as follows:

- Bilingual Education and English Language Acquisition
- Foreign Language
- Mathematics
- Reading Specialists
- Science
- Special Education
- Other teacher shortage areas identified by the state in which you will teach at the time you receive your TEACH Grant.

### • USDE-Designated Low Income Schools

The USDE's *Annual Directory of Designated Low-Income Schools for Teacher Cancellation* designates schools that serve low-income students. Those schools meet the TEACH Grant requirement of public or private elementary or secondary schools that serve low-income students.

### • The TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve

The TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve provides the conditions under which the grant will be awarded and the teaching service requirements. According to the agreement, a grant recipient must:

- Serve as a full-time teacher for a total of at least four academic years within eight years of completing a teaching program.
- Serve as a highly qualified teacher<sup>4</sup> at a USDE-designated low-income public or private non-profit elementary or secondary school.
- Carry out the teaching service requirement within a high-need field.
- Provide certification of employment annually by completing the online TEACH Grant certification form or by downloading a form from the forms section at [www.dl.ed.gov](http://www.dl.ed.gov).
- Meet any additional requirements that the USDE deems necessary.

The TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve also requires the recipient to acknowledge that the failure to complete the teaching service requirement will result in the total TEACH Grant award amount being converted to an unsubsidized Direct Stafford Loan, to be repaid with interest accruing from the first disbursement date of each grant.

<sup>4</sup> The USDE defines “highly qualified teacher” in Section 901 of the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act*. In Iowa, highly qualified means to hold an endorsement in the subject area taught.
